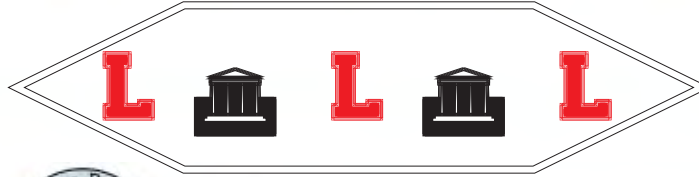

To Whom It May Concern: DPS/PSB Board Member,

I can not understand your even considering the proposed change to Rule 35.311 under EXEMPTIONS after you have passed Rule 35.14 UNLICENSED GENERAL CONTRACTOR or OTHER INTERMEDIARIES.

Individuals such as carpenters are Contractors. If they provide a regulated service they should be licensed to do so. These type individuals are not allowed to perform any other regulated service such as plumbing, AIC, or electrical work without these license. Why would the security industry allow them to perform security work, which could affect the safety of the end user, without a security license?

When an individual purchases hardware (lockset) to place in their home or business, they may install or place the hardware themselves, but if they pay someone else to install or place the hardware it becomes a 'contracted service' and is a regulated security service, which requires a license.

Rule 35.14 should apply regardless of the size or location of the Contractor.

There is no need to add anything to Rule 35.311 EXEMPTIONS.

Please make no changes to Rule 35.311.

Sunset Commission Meeting Dates for DPS

These recommendations will then be presented to the 81st Texas Legislature when it meets in regular session beginning in January 2009.

QUESTIONS ASKED ?????

Dennis E. Smith, New Boston, TX writes in.....

"In your September Advisor you said. send in questions. My question is:

"What is the texas definition of burglary tools and how it effects the unlocking of autos, homes and businesses?"

and

"What is insurance companys feelings concerning the above involving police and tow trucks unlocking cars and other unlicensed people who have auto lockout."

QUESTIONS ANSWERED !!!!!

Thank you Mr. Smith - and below may be some of the answers you are looking for from our own Bill Bybee, Sergeant at Arms of TLA.

"To answer your question, you would need to get an official ruling from the AG's office, but this is the way I understand the law at this time.

I talked to my son that is a Sgt. in the Sheriff's Dept. He said that, this is a real grey area. What is a Burglary Tool ? It can be a lot of things. A pry bar, A slide hammer, Picks & pick guns, and Bump keys, opening tools for auto, etc. It could be about any tool in your tool box.

To start with, any Tom, Dick, or Felon in the State of Texas can open cars. There is no law to stop anyone from opening a business to unlock cars. Car Lots, Tow Trucks, Unlock Services, Pop A Lock, and just any one that has a Slim-Jim can go out and open cars. The only thing an officer can do is look at the persons back ground and see if they are a felon and if they were in an area that has had a lot of burglaries. They may try to match the tool to the crime.

The law does say that they can not advertise under Locks & Locksmith in the yellow pages, unless you have a B number. (locksmith license) We are working right now on trying to come up with a way to stop all of these scammers from using the yellow pages, but you are talking big money.

As far as the Insurance goes, there is no law that says that you have to have insurance to open cars, unless you are a locksmith. I am sure that Tow trucks and other businesses like that are required to have insurance.

You know that all of this did not change when the Locksmith law came in to being. Everyone is still doing the same thing that they were doing before the law as far as car openings. The only thing that changed was opening buildings, doing rekeys, defeating locks, and locksmith work....You need a license.....
